

Rockets destroy ozone

1.

Rockets create local ozone holes. Their radical emissions cause immediate, almost total ozone destruction for up to hundreds of square miles and lasting days

2.

Rocket exhaust and pollutants react with and destroy ozone over the long term.

3.

Rocket pollutants and water vapor block the sun from replenishing ozone in the stratosphere

The shockwave of de-orbitting debris, satellites, and rockets creates nitric oxide which destroys ozone.





Fig. 1. Population estimate (including 95% confidence intervals) and trend of Piping Plovers at Boca Chica, 2018-2021.



SpaceX Blast Left Officials in Disbelief Over Environmental Damage

Fish and Wildlife Service biologists expressed frustrations in emails obtained by Bloomberg.

Left a 385-acre debris field that flung concrete chunks as far as 2,680 feet from the launchpad, sparked 3.5acre state park fire

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) documented that the debris cloud of pulverized **concrete** deposited material as far as six-and-a-half miles north of the launch pad.

Wildlife officials questioned at the time if they were being blocked from the explosion site after they were unable to view the area for 48 hours had passed, according to communication records obtained by Bloomberg.






